Applications are invited for Teaching Fellowships to provide teaching for undergraduates in the Faculty of Economics for one year beginning in October 2017. Candidates should normally be registered graduate students within the University of Cambridge.

Part 2A Paper 8 History and Philosophy of Economics

The Faculty wishes to appoint Teaching Fellow for a paper in Part IIA of the Economics Tripos. This would be a partial appointment, and the Faculty expects around 35-40 students to be registered for the paper.

A Teaching Fellow would be required to give supervisions and **mark all assignments for each supervision**. He or she would be paid by colleges in the normal way (current rate is £43.21 per hour for groups of 6). The Faculty would, in addition, pay a retainer of £3000 for a Teaching Fellow with a standard teaching load of 50-60 hours (but proportional for less than 60 hours.)

There may also be duties related to teaching support, as directed by the paper co-ordinator. The teaching requirement for this paper would be in both the Michaelmas and Lent Terms.

Facilities for Teaching Fellows include free printing of supervision material, and Prizes of up to £500. The criteria for the award of the prizes would be an overall satisfaction of 4, and no marginal cases will be considered. The number of respondents for the surveys would also be taken into consideration.

Those appointed to the Fellowships will be required to attend a training session on small-group teaching just prior to the beginning of the Michaelmas Term. Any graduate student applying for one of these Fellowships should first discuss their intention with their supervisor, and provide a statement to the effect that their supervisor is supportive of them taking a Teaching Fellow position, and attach it with their application.
